






Central Authority Conviction Exchange

- EU Member States begin exchanging criminal records information between dedicated central authorities under CFD 2005/876/JHA.
- Two parts to the process:
 - 1) Requests
 - 2) Notifications








Identity Issues

- Correct identification of persons becoming an issue for EU Member States
- UK request that fingerprints should be included within the arrangements for conviction exchange to improve the identification of persons







EU Commission Bid

ACRO placed a bid to the EU Commission to fund a project which concerned proving the benefits in underpinning the current conviction exchange process with fingerprints.

The bid was successful and the FEEU project commenced in April 2009.







Project Deliverables

- Fingerprint Facility Develop a facility capable of processing the requirement of the international exchange of fingerprints
- Workshop with EU Member States Negotiate and make arrangements for fingerprint exchange
- **EU Index of Non-EU Nationals** Explore the challenges and benefits of how fingerprints could be utilised to support a potential EU index of non-EU national offenders
- Host an EU Conference





Fingerprint Facility - Objectives

- Create a dedicated fingerprint bureau to support the exchange of conviction data between the UK and other EU Member States.
- Procurement of Hardware and Software
- Employ fingerprint officers
- Explore possibilities of exchanging fingerprints electronically





Fingerprint Facility Achievement of Objective

- Collaboration with a local police force (Hampshire Constabulary)
- Employed two Tenprint Technicians to process incoming fingerprints onto the UK national AFIS (IDENT1) and to extract fingerprints from the database to send to respective EU Member States
- Additional equipment; AFIS terminals, scanners, printers and other peripherals





Achievement of Objective Cont'd

- 1) Manual Process Hard copy fingerprints printed directly from IDENT1
- 2) ACRO Fingerprint Application The ability to convert hard copy tenprint cards into NIST, JPEG, PDF and TIF files. The ability to convert incoming NIST files to JPEG, PDF and TIF formats. Ability to encrypt the files for secure transmission to EU Member States.
- 3) IDENT1 Interface Extract NIST files directly from IDENT1 at the UK Central Authority
- **4) ECRIS** IDENT1 interface and ACRO Fingerprint Application capabilities



Workshop with EU Member States - Objectives

- Run workshops with EU Member States to explore exchange possibilities
- Secure arrangements to exchange fingerprints with EU Member States
- Collate data and case studies from the exchange of fingerprints
- Develop a mutual understanding of the benefits of utilising fingerprint exchange for these purposes






Workshop with EU Member States

- Visited 18 Member States
- Documented the current position and challenges
- 12 arrangements agreed
- Flexible solutions
- Manual & Electronic
- Pilot exchanged with 14 EU Member States



Cyprus, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta & Romania





January 2010 - UK places a wanted marker on the PNC for an individual known as Male A

June 2010 - the UKCA-ECR makes a request to Lithuania for an individual known as Male B. The request was sent with fingerprints.

July 2010 - Similar match made to this name. Fingerprints are checked and match those of Male A Information is passed back to the UK that Male B is Male A. He is actively sought by the UK to be arrested and extradited to Lithuania.



UKCA-ECR receives the notification and creates a record on the PNC for Male A.

Fingerprints are checked and match the record of Male B

Lithuania are informed of the identity discrepancy and the PNC record is made over into the correct record.

Lithuania sends a conviction notification to the UK for an individual known as Male A. The notification was sent with fingerprints

Records would not have been linked if it were not for the exchange of fingerprints



Romanian individual charged with Rapes of two vulnerable persons in the UK

UKCA-ECR requests previous convictions from Romania.

The response comes back with this person having a previous conviction for Rape in Romania.

The Romanian suspect denies that these are his convictions.


Fingerprints are sent to Romania and the result confirms the identity of these convictions to this person



The UK were then able to use these convictions as supporting evidence. The individual was handed a life sentence without parole for 11 years.




Greece, Ireland, Portugal & Slovenia

Spanish national convicted in UK

– Male A – Conviction
notification and Fingerprints
sent to Spain.

Names checked against the Spanish population register with no hit to a Spanish citizen.

Fingerprints checked against the AFIS and matched Male B who is wanted in Spain for a Serious Assault

Spain were unaware that this person was in the UK and would not have been identified if fingerprints were not sent



Results - Outgoing

Approximately <u>9,000</u> sets of fingerprints have been sent to EU Member States

47% of fingerprints matched fingerprints on EU databases

16% of the matching fingerprints proved that false or different alphanumeric details had been used

7.4% of all conviction notifications that were sent with fingerprints matched records where different or false identity details had been used



Results - Incoming

63% of fingerprints of convicted UK nationals sent from EU Member States matched fingerprints on the UK AFIS

21.4% of these matches related to false or different alphanumeric details

13.4% of all conviction notifications of UK nationals that were sent with fingerprints matched records where different or false identity details had been used





Results Summary

- Improves integrity of data
- Assists in the ability to use previous convictions in the prosecution and sentencing of offenders
- Assists in the elimination of the innocent
- Identify wanted persons
- EU Member States able to build comprehensive databases (fingerprints and conviction data) of their citizens that have committed crimes within the EU

Prüm & FEEU

Austrian National Convicted in the UK

Conviction notification sent to Austria and loaded to Austrian Criminal Record

Austrian AFIS searched using Prüm - No Hit

If fingerprints were loaded to the Austrian
AFIS and exchanged through the
conviction process, a positive hit would
have occurred when the second search
was conducted using Prüm

Same Austrian national comes to notice in Poland under a different name

Request for previous convictions sent to Austria - No Hit

Austrian AFIS searched using Prüm - No Hit



Spanish national convicted in UK

– Male A – Conviction
notification & fingerprints sent
to Spain – 10yrs Imprisonment
for Serious Drugs offences.

Names checked against the Spanish population register and matches a legitimate Spanish citizen.

Fingerprints checked against the AFIS and did not match the fingerprints held for Male A.

Intelligence passed to the UK. It is believed this person is an Ecuadorian national and arrangements have been made for his extradition after he has served his sentence.





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European Criminal Record Information System (ECRIS)

- Means to exchange conviction information between EU Central Authorities
- Allows for the exchange of Tenprints (NIST) but not mandatory
- Means of exchange and not a system for processing fingerprints
- Countries to have systems ready by April 2012
- Secure route via sTESTA network







EU Index of TCN Nationals

- Explore how fingerprints could be used in an EU index of convicted third country nationals
- Pilot exchange to explore benefits
- Report findings to EU Commission
